Dear Students,



Rules for admission:

- Candidates/ Parents/ Guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and submit application form complete in all respect to the admission committee.
- The candidate has to fill up the particulars neatly in the prescribed admission form in his/ her own hand writing.
- Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility criteria.
- **Any gap in the academic career of applicant must be supported by an undertaking/Affidavit by the candidate.**
- A student must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- Rules for admission are subject to change as per SPU Mandi & Dept. of Higher Education (H. P.) notification from time to time.
- A candidate having compartment in 10+2 in any subject is not eligible for seeking admission in B. A. / B. Com. / B. Sc. 1st Year.
- Admission of a student is liable to cancellation if he/ she furnishes incomplete/ false information in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will be taken against such candidates.
- Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of HP Bonafide certificate for fee-concession.
- Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- Student seeking exemption from fee and funds for specially abled person must attach an attested copy of minimum 40% disability certificate.
- Students who have been expelled or rusticated from any institution will not be eligible for admission.
- Student from National Open School will be eligible only if they are passed in all five subjects including English.
- All admissions are provisional and subject to final approval by SPU Mandi/ HPU Shimla.
- A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid by the SPU Mandi.
- Admission of students in B. A. /B. Com. / B. Sc. 2nd /3rd Year will be on roll on basis (Provisional Admission). They will be promoted to next class subject to fulfillment of the eligibility criteria after the declaration of result of their previous class by the SPU Mandi/ HPU Shimla.

Important Documents required for admission in B. A./ B. Com./ B. Sc. 1st/ 2nd / 3rd Year before the admission committee at the time of admission along with the original documents:

1. Attested copy of **Matriculation Examination**/ Date of Birth Certificate.
2. Attested copy of **Detailed Marks Card** of the 10+2 or equivalent examination.
3. Two passport size photographs of the candidate.
4. **Original Character Certificate** from the institution last attended for regular students.
5. **Original Character Certificate** from the 1st class Magistrate/ Pradhan Gram Panchayat for privately 10+2 or equivalent passed candidates or with gap in studies after 10+2 or in studies etc. (If required).
6. Attested copy of SC/ ST/ OBC /EWS certificate issued by 1st class Magistrate (If Eligible).
7. Attested copy of **Migration Certificate** (in case of examination passed from other Board/University other than H.P. Board).
8. A passport size photograph of the parents to be affixed on PTA membership form.
9. **Undertaking/ Affidavit** by the candidate for Gap in the academic career.
10. Attested copy of HP bonafide Certificate (for girls only if Eligible).
11. Copy of previous exam result B. A. / B. Com. / B. Sc. 1st / 2nd Year (If applicable).
12. Admit Card of last Examination B. A. / B. Com. / B. Sc. 1st / 2nd Year (If applicable).

Eligibility Condition for Admission (for B.A. /B.Com. /B.Sc.1st year) Age Limit:

An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 1st July of the year 2023 i.e. must not have born earlier to 01-07-2000 (01-07-1998 for girls). Only the Vice Chancellor shall have the power of granting age relaxation upto a maximum of 6 months.

For SC/ST students, however the age limit will be raised by 3 years.

Minimum Pass Percentage for admission in different faculties is given as:-

i) B.A.1st year (Bachelor of Arts)

A student seeking admission to B.A. 1st year with Mathematics as one of the subject of study should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at 10+2 level. A candidate who has passed 10+2 examination in four compulsory subjects (including English) with 33% marks from any university/board recognized by law can seek admission in B.A. 1st year.

ii) B.Com. 1st year (Bachelor of Commerce)

- a) 40% for those who has passed examination under Commerce group at 10+2 level.
- b) 45% for others.
- c) For admission to B.Com. 1st year the candidate must have passed Maths/ Economics as compulsory subjects with 45% marks at his/her 10+2 level. There is relaxation of 5% marks for SC/ST students for admission to Commerce faculty.

iii) B.Sc.1st year (Bachelor of Science)

Candidate must have studied Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Mathematics & English as compulsory subject with 45% marks in aggregate at 10+2 level. There is relaxation of 5% marks for SC/ST students for admission to science faculty.

- **Students who are placed under compartment at 10+2 level are not eligible to seek admission in B. A./ B. Com./ B. Sc. 1st year.**
- **STUDENTS WHO ARE PLACED UNDER COMPARTMENT IN ANY EXAMINATION OF ANOTHER BOARD/UNIVERSITY SHALL NOT APPLY EVEN FOR PROVISIONAL ADMISSION TO THE NEXT HIGHER CLASS IN THIS COLLEGE.**

Academic Qualification: A student must pass in the senior secondary (+2) Examination conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education, C.B.S.E.or an examination accepted as equivalent by S P University:-

- I. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. 1st Year.
- II. Provided that candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com 1st Year.
- III. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts, Stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. 1st Year

NOTE: Rules regarding eligibility conditions for admission to B. A./ B. Com./ B. Sc. 1st year are subject to change as per the directions of H.P. Govt. / H.P.U. Shimla/ S. P. U. Mandi.

1. Eligibility for the Degree

- 1.1.A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College affiliated to the S. P. University/ H.P. University for a period of not less than three academic year (and not more than five academic years) passed the examination and fulfilled such conditions as have been prescribed therefore.
- 1.2.There shall be no private or other category of students. The student shall be eligible for degree either through regular mode or through distance education mode only.
- 1.3.For the degree (B.A./B.Sc./B. Com.), the student will have to earn minimum of 132 successful credits hours of course work for over a minimum of three and maximum of five years from the date of admission.

RULES FOR REFUSAL OF ADMISSION/ RE-ADMISSION

1. Not with standing eligibility for admission, the Principal may refuse admission in any of the following cases:
 - ii) If the conduct of the student has been found unsatisfactory during the previous session.
 - ii) On the ground of inadequate capacity in a particular class.
 - iii) On the ground of indiscipline, misbehavior, misconduct, ragging including unruly riotous acts.
2. Students found indulging in ragging shall summarily be expelled from the college.
3. **Name of a student who remains absent continuously for a period of ten days without any sanctioned leave shall be struck off from the college rolls.**
4. **A student whose name has been struck off twice shall not be readmitted in the session.**
5. In case the name of the candidate is struck off because of continuous absence of 10 days or any indiscipline, the re-admission is permissible **within one week** subject to the satisfaction of concerned teachers/ discipline committee with an admission fee of Rs.100/- failing which his/ her name will **stand struck off permanently.**
6. In case of the name of candidate is struck off again because of any reason mentioned above the admission is permissible within one week on payment of Rs.200/- as second re-admission **fee in the presence of the parents only; failing which after 7 days his/her name will permanently be struck off the college Rolls and not be granted re-admission at all.**

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Pursuing the aim to enhance and give boost to enrolment in Higher Education, University Grant Commission has proposed Rashtriya Uchtar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). Under this programme, the CBCS has been introduced with a vision to enhance the quality of education. The new UGC CBCS system has been approved and adopted by the Department of Higher Education and SPU Mandi since session 2022-23 and the admission for the session 2023-24 will also be in accordance with the new system.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

1. **Core Course:** 6 Discipline Specific Core Courses (DSC) (2 per subject) in B. Sc. & 4 Discipline Specific Core Courses (DSC) (2 per subject) and 2 Courses of English and Hindi in B.A./B.Com. The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also, the course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** (2 each for B.A. /B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; I. Environmental Science and ii. English/Hindi/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
 - 3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.
 - 3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/ hands-on/ training/ field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.
 - 3.3 **Practical/ tutorials** (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to

add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.

CREDIT SCHEME

1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core courses each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two courses from the list of Generic Electives courses.
2. An undergraduate degree in science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
3. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:
 - i) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration per week
 - ii) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration per week
 - iii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two-hour duration per week

Facilities for Students

Leave Rules

- i. Student can avail leave with prior permission after properly applying for leave. A tutor can recommend leave up to 3 days. A student must get application signed by senior tutor for leave up to 7 days.
- ii. Leave during house examination will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of senior tutor.

PTA

The PTA is a formal organization to strengthen the role parents in the institution for the betterment of their wards and also to protect their interests. Parents of students contribute towards PTA fund at the time of admission.

Tutorial Groups:

Every student is assigned a tutorial group which normally consisted of 40-50 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students have to seek advice of their tutor for all problems. They have to get their identity card signed by the concerned tutor/ senior tutor. Identity cards must be complete in all respects within 15 days after admission.

Sports Activities:

The college provides facilities to those who wish to make a mark in sports. College sends team for various University Championships like Athletics, Chess, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kabaddi, Basketball and Weight lifting (M/W). Annual Athletic Meet of the college is also another opportunity for the students to show their caliber and excellence in Athletics and Sports.

Cultural Activities

As we know that in our country there is a diversity of culture and perpetually needs to be grown and develop. Thus, the institution also provides a platform to students to show their talent through various cultural activities at S.P.U. / H.P.U. Youth Festival, Inter College and Intra College Competition. They get a chance to participate in Debate, declamation, poetic recitation, elocution, quiz, drama, skit, mime & group dance etc.

Library:

The library of an institution is a reflection of its intellectual worth. The college has rich library having a collection of 1312 books along with the **reading room**. To keep the students abreast with current affairs library subscribes to 2 newspapers.

Eco-Club:

Our college has an Eco Club sanctioned by the State Science and Technology Department, H.P. is working in the college to encourage activities like afforestation, sanitation, environment sustainability, conservation, garbage disposal etc. Students participate and create awareness through various activities like poster making awareness campaigns etc.

National Service Scheme (NSS):

The National Service Scheme currently comprises of 50 volunteers. The enrolment is made by Programme Officer on the basis of selection. In every academic session our students participate in number of social programmes organised in the college and outside the college.

Red Ribbon Club

In order to raise awareness level regarding the dreaded HIV /AIDS, blood donation, drug abuse and other related issues, the college has framed Red Ribbon Club.

College Magazine:

College is a platform for creative buds to recognize their talent and to provide them a forum for the manifestation of their creativity, the College magazine "TATWANI" is brought out annually.
